Andreas Bodenstein von Karlstadt (1486-1541) was a theologian and professor at Wittenberg An earlier supporter of Luther, he participated in the debate with Johannes Eck (1486-1543) in 1518 and was among the first reformers to implement some of Luther's teachings In 1521-22, Luther and Karlstadt began to disagree
